  - (ii) "... You don't have to be afraid. I've known lots of people that have done it"
    - a) Who speaks these words? What does the speaker refer to as 'it'? (2 marks)
    - b) What character traits of the speaker are revealed in these lines? (3 marks)
  - (iii) "So please your grace, my ancient: A man he is of honesty and trust..."
    - a) Who speaks these words? (1 mark)
    - b) What is the significance of this utterance to the development of the plot of the Drama? (4 marks)

Who does the speaker address as "you" in this utterance? (2 marks) (b) What qualities of the speaker are revealed in these words? (3 marks) "Do you know many of the people round here?"   - (b) Essay type questions (10 marks)
