(1) CAPTURING THE BENEFITS OF TOURISM FOR SRI LANKA

The tourism industry makes a significant contribution to the growth and diversification of Sri Lanka's economy. it should be considered a key pillar of the economy and a priority in government decision-making. facilitated by the public sector, the private sector should play a lead in the development of the tourism industry. (TSP- 2017-2002, pg13)

Economic benefit – tourism should result in optimal economic benefit to Sri Lanka's economy by way of maximum net foreign exchange income, spreading of development throughout the country and creating significant employment for Sri Lankans. (Tourism Mater plan-1993, pg83)

marine resources for sustainable development by 2030, increase the economic benefits of small island destinations and low-income countries from the sustainable use of marine resources, including through sustainable management of fisheries, aquaculture, and tourism (TSP-2017-2020. Pg 12)
