# 1. EITHER

(a) "Adventure and exploration are key ingredients in Enid Blyton's *Five on a Treasure Island* (1942)". With close reference to the text, analyse the significance of adventure and exploration within the narrative.

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(b) Critically evaluate the construction of children within Enid Blyton's *Five on a Treasure Island* (1942), paying close attention to the socio-cultural specificities of such constructions.

# 2. EITHER

(a) Would you agree with the view that R.K. Narayan's Swami and Friends (1935) can be firmly positioned within the school story genre? Justify your response through close references to the text.

## OR

(b) Critically examine the nexus between the child and colonialism in R.K. Narayan's *Swami and Friends* (1935).

# (3) EITHER

(a) "T.B. Ilangaratne's *Amba Yahaluwo* (1957) explores issues of social class and education in post-Independence Sri Lanka." Discuss, with close reference to the text.

## OR

(b) "While the trope of friendship predominates T.B. Ilangaratne's Amba Yahaluwo (1957), the intersections of childhood and class are equally significant." Undertake a close analysis of the text in light of the above statement.

# 4. EITHER

(a) Would you agree with the view that in J.K. Rowling's Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone (1997), the protagonist's self-definition is inextricably tied to the school context? Discuss with close reference to the text.

(b) What elements of the fantasy genre can be identified in J.K. Rowling's *Harry Potter* and the Philosopher's Stone (1997)? Discuss with detailed reference to the text.

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
